

Annual Friends Summer Book Sale



The lineup this year brings back some old favorites to the library as well as some new first time performers. A donation to the Bourne Food Pantry is your ticket into the show. Bring a lawn chair, blanket, bug spray and a picnic dinner to enjoy. Concerts are held rain or shine but do move inside if

weather is not cooperative. This year's lineup includes:

Wed. July 2nd - Stefilia's Little Stones – a fantastically fun folk family show includes singing, dancing, laughing and a super fun rocking good time. (This show is part of the Children's summer family night programs and is sponsored by the Friends of JBPL.)

Wed. July 9th – Moby Dick & the Wailers – Led by Quincy native and trombonist John DeMasi, enjoy an evening of Chicago-style swing music and ballads from the late 30s through 70s.

Wed. July 16th – Stanley & Grimm – Fiddler Nikki Engstrom and singer/guitarist Sean Brennan return with their interpretations of Irish jigs, reels, fiddle, guitar and voice.

Wed. July 23rd – Bob Hayes Band – “Not your grandfather's jazz band”. Cape Cod jazz ensemble performing in many different styles including blues, rock and latin.

Wed. July 30th – Gerry Johnston – Returning to JBPL for the first time in three years, Mr. Johnston is a solo jazz and classical guitarist performing selections from the Great American Songbook.


Did you know? By having a certified public library, Bourne residents are able to get a library card at any public library in the state.

Meet the Authors




More FREEGAL Music For You

Mon – July 14th – Strategic Path to Employment: How to prepare yourself for the job search ahead – Getting a job requires more than just a resume and interview. Learn how to prepare to stand out from others and make your upcoming job search a success.

Mon – July 21st – Career Change – Starting Over or Re-Entering the Work Force – Are you thinking about changing your career? Are you needing to apply for a job and worried that your age may hinder your chances? Have you been out of the work force a while and now need to re-enter it? This workshop is for you.
