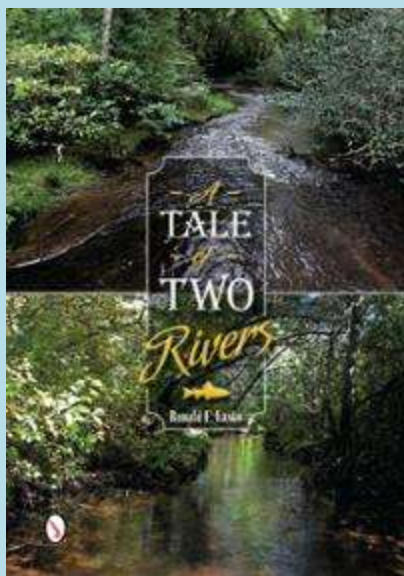

## Job Seekers Grant Workshops

The Jonathan Bourne Public Library is pleased to announce that it has been awarded an LSTA (Library Services and Technology Act) grant to provide resources for job seekers. Funded through the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners with funds from LSTA, a Federal source of library funding provided by the Institute of Museum and Library Services, the grant will allow the JBPL to provide materials, workshops and databases for those looking for some assistance finding employment.

To kick off the program, Information Technology Librarian Debra Berry will be offering a three week workshop series. ***Each session will be held on a Tuesday evening at 6:30 p.m. here at the library.*** The schedule is as follows:

**November 19<sup>th</sup> - Resume Writing & Cover Letters: Making yourself stand out. (with Ann Davis Goodrum, Life & Career Coach.)**

**November 26<sup>th</sup> – Practical Aspects of Getting a Job: Now That you have your resume, what do you do with it? (with Jill Grindle, Pinnacle Resumes.)**

**December 3<sup>rd</sup> – Interviewing & Presentation (with Ann Davis Goodrum.)**
